Stephanie Eberhardt is an Assistant Attorney General in the Consumer Protection Division of the Office of the Attorney General of Texas. Her practice involves investigating and litigating against individuals and businesses for violations of the Texas Deceptive Trade Practices—Consumer Protection Act. Since joining the Attorney General's Office in 2014, she has worked on cases involving high school diploma mills, the sale of synthetic marijuana in retail establishments, and price-gouging related to Hurricane Harvey. Ms. Eberhardt has also second-chaired a jury trial against a debt collector who was filing suits in the wrong venue, obtaining a permanent injunction and over \$25 million in civil penalties and attorneys' fees. As part of the Texas OAG efforts against synthetic marijuana retailers, Ms. Eberhardt has obtained multiple permanent injunctions against Houston-area businesses selling synthetic marijuana.

Ms. Eberhardt is a graduate of Rice University and a graduate of the University of Houston Law Center, where she was a Senior Articles Editor for the Houston Journal of International Law and a recipient of the James Baker Hughes Prize for Outstanding Comment in International Law.
