Legal Internship Summer 2023

The National Consumer Law Center (NCLC) is seeking rising 3rd year law students for a Summer 2021 Legal Internship in our Boston office. NCLC Legal Interns are assigned to teams of 3-4 attorneys in our office with a designated Supervisor. Orientation, training programs and supervision are provided. Excellent writing and analytic skills are required.

NCLC, a national legal services nonprofit, works for economic justice for low-income and other disadvantaged people in the U.S. through policy analysis and advocacy, publications, litigation, and training. NCLC's talented staff work with nonprofit and legal services organizations, private attorneys, policymakers, and federal and state government and courts across the nation to stop exploitative practices, help financially stressed families build and retain wealth, and advance economic fairness. RESPONSIBILITIES:

Different teams focus on litigation, non-mortgage lending (credit cards, auto student loans, various forms of predatory loan products, etc), mortgage lending, bankruptcy, access to utilities and racial justice/equal economic opportunities issues. Assignments range from researching and drafting litigation memos and briefs, investigative reports, training materials, policy analyses and articles. Interns also have the chance to contribute to NCLC's Consumer Law manuals. Opportunities to attend Court hearings, trials, legislative and regulatory proceedings, trainings, webinars and conferences are dependent upon the events that arise during the course of the summer, but Interns are encouraged to participate whenever possible.
