DANE COUNTY FORECLOSURE MEDIATION PROGRAM

Mediation is a confidential and voluntary process where you and the lender seeking to foreclose on your home may discuss ways to resolve your foreclosure case, including reinstatement of the loan and modification of the loan terms. You must live in and own the property that is subject to this foreclosure action to qualify for mediation under this program.

To Request a Mediation Conference:

Complete the attached Mediation Request form. It must be received by the program within 10 days from the date you were served the Summons and Complaint. Send the form by fax, e-mail or United States mail to:

What happens after you request mediation?

A Case Manager will review your request and notify you and the lender as to whether your case can be accepted into the program. If accepted, you will meet with a U.W. Law student and a housing counselor. If the lender agrees to mediation, a conference with you and the lender will be scheduled. A non-refundable \$75 fee will be charged to the homeowner and to the lender.

A Mediation Request is NOT a response to the Summons.

The mediation program is separate from the foreclosure lawsuit that has been started against you. It may resolve the underlying claim but the lawsuit will continue if mediation is attempted. Please read the Summons and Complaint. Make sure you understand your rights and the time period for filing an Answer or Responsive Pleading. If you do not file an Answer or Responsive Pleading, the court may grant judgment against you and you may lose your home and your right to object to anything that you disagree with in the Complaint.

Legal Assistance

The University of Wisconsin Law School's Consumer Clinic has forms available to help you respond to the Summons. Call (608) 263-6283 for information or assistance. The Mediation Program does not provide legal assistance to either side in the foreclosure lawsuit.
